Addition to the proposed measures in terms of the air traffic from Europe from March 15:

It regards the operations of KLM, TUI and Condor

- 1) As of March 15 Hato Airport is closed to all traffic from Europe until further notice.
- 2) From an operational perspective and useful crew utilization, KLM and TUI indicated that they prefer operating according to the existing timetables.
- 3) In conformity with the decision of the Council of Ministers passengers cannot be carried from Europe, with the exception of certain groups, e.g. medical specialists, nurses and other professionals.
- 4) The Council of Ministers decided that all residents of Curacao, who already dispose of a return ticket and who want to return from Europe, will be given the opportunity to do so. This is evaluated on a day-to-day basis.
- 5) All passengers who want to travel to Europe from Curacao will be accommodated on the regular flights. KLM and TUI will, for the time being, continue the flights as regular services under the same flight numbers.
- 6) As there is no reason to assume that the virus is transmitted through cargo, the transportation of cargo is exempted from the measures.
- 7) Circle flights AMS – BON/AUA – CUR remain permitted. Passengers from BON/AUA to AMS via CUR remain on the plane and do NOT go in transit at HATO Airport.
- 8) The proposed measures are applicable until further notice.
- 9) It is agreed with Winair/Air Antilles and Aruba Airlines that passengers carried from Europe are NOT transferred to Curacao with Aruba Airlines, Winair and/or Jetair.

Today, Saturday March 14, the decisions reached are addressed further during the informative session regarding Curacao and the Coronavirus that takes place daily at 12:30 o'clock.
